

## Baroque? This concert won't cost you any money

Richmond native Annalisa Pappano performs as part of Catacoustic Consort during a free concert Sunday at St. Paul's Episcopal Church in Richmond.

The 3 p.m. event is sponsored by the Richmond Symphony Orchestra, made possible by a grant through the **Wayne County Foundation** and community support.

The show, "In Song Lay My Desire," will feature music from Renaissance chamber music to Italian Baroque music, which was during the birth of opera.

To recreate the sound of the music from when it was performed, the pieces will be performed on instruments from the time period. These instruments include the viola da gamba, theorbo, organ, harpsichord, Baroque guitar and lute.

The concert also is the debut of Catacoustic's Baroque harp, an instrument strung with three parallel rows of strings.

The Cincinnati-based Catacoustic Consort is dedicated to understanding the life and times of when the music was played. An informed humanities presentation will accompany the group's programs.

Other performers will include Michael

Leopold, Sherezade Panthaki and Chiara Granata. Leopold and Granata are traveling from Milan, Italy, for the performance.

Pappano is the daughter of Michael and Diana Pappin of Richmond. She graduated from Interlochen Arts Academy and the Early Music Institute of Indiana University School of Music.

Pappano has performed throughout the United States.
